SIMON WEAVER

After a hugely disappointing result and performance in midweek, collectively we are pleased to have an opportunity to right some wrongs here this afternoon against Crewe.

Last time out against Mansfield, there is no getting away from the fact that we had let our supporters down hugely. We put up a poor performance which was absent of the hunger and desire in which we pride ourselves. That was the real frustration upon leaving the stadium on Tuesday night.

As manager, I have to take responsibility for that. We watched the game back and on Thursday we sat down as a group to watch some clips to learn from our mistakes.

It's fair to say that we underwhelmed after what was a good result against Colchester last Saturday and on the back of that there has been a lot of hurt around the camp.

Comparing those two performances, we were an absolute shadow of ourselves. However, I've spoken before about the importance of bouncing back quickly and here today I believe we have an opportunity to just that.

Playing at home, we want to play our part in getting an atmosphere going within the ground. The only way we can do that is by putting on a performance that fans can get behind.

For me, that isn't just making a bright start in the opening minutes, it's about being aggressive from set-plays, it's about playing with pace on the counter, it's about having that bravery to make things happen.

If we are to start improving on our home form, it's important that we start getting wins on the board as soon as possible and that starts today. Crewe



themselves will be bringing a strong away following and on the pitch, they come here on the back of what has been a really strong start to the season.

They are right up there battling and with that there are a lot of similarities to the game on Tuesday, therefore there is no doubt that this is another big challenge for us.

I spoke to Lee Bell at a LMA meeting before the season started and he is a really good guy. I'm really looking forward to what should be a really good matchup here.

Of course, last season, they staged a really late comeback here to deny us the three points. Looking back on that, both teams are in better shape now and I'm sure, like us, that they'll want to improve on their league position last season.

For us, that is a non-negotiable within our group but after showings like that, a lot of words can be spoken about bouncing back and setting things straight which is all well and good. For me personally, it's about actions and actually getting out there and showing improvement on the pitch.

Within us, there is a burning desire to improve on our form at home and I think that desire is something which makes this game a hugely important one for us. To improve on our own performances, the focus has to be on us and not the teams which we are going up against.

Everyone knows that there are no easy games at this level. However, we have to focus on getting our performances to match up with the ones we are putting in away from home.

Speaking earlier about Mansfield wanting it more, that is nothing to do with ability, tactics or formations that's about heart and desire. We have to strip things back a little bit and focus on nailing those basics.

After we start to consistently do that well then I believe that is when the quality which we have within our ranks will start to shine.

I've spoken before about the consistency in our approach and the last few days have been no different. No one, is getting too high on the back of



good results and equally now, no one is getting too low on the back of Tuesday night's result.

We come here today demanding a reaction from within. If we can do that, we hope to play our part in making a great atmosphere. We cross that white line with the desire to turn in a performance which you in the terraces can get behind.

As always, your support never goes unnoticed and we hope to repay that backing by getting back to winning ways here today.

REMEMBERING FERGUS DONALDSON

As we gather for today's game, we come together to remember and honour the life of Fergus Donaldson, a beloved former player and coach of Harrogate Town who passed away recently, leaving behind a legacy of hard work, dedication, and unwavering commitment to the club.

Fergus's journey with Harrogate Town began in the 1982-83 season, during a challenging period for the club as they competed in the Northern Counties League. This was an era where club competition was fierce, and other clubs often had more financial resources to attract players. Fergus was a no-nonsense, hard-working centre half who quickly established himself as a leader on and off the pitch.

By the 1984-85 season, Fergus had earned the captain's armband, a testament to his leadership qualities and dedication to the club's success. Even after retiring from active involvement in the club, Fergus remained a passionate supporter, attending numerous games and becoming an integral part of the Harrogate Town walking football team. He was a popular figure among fans, players, and fellow supporters, his presence serving as a source of inspiration and unity.

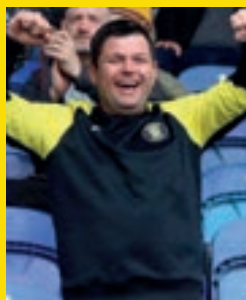

JOSH FALKINGHAM

EARLIER THIS SEASON, IT WAS ANNOUNCED THAT CLUB CAPTAIN JOSH FALKINGHAM HAD ACCEPTED A COACHING ROLE WITHIN THE CLUB'S PLAYER DEVELOPMENT CENTRE. THE 33-YEAR-OLD IS NO STRANGER TO COACHING HAVING DONE SO PREVIOUSLY WITH THE CLUB.

HOWEVER, WHEN DISCUSSING THIS NEW ROLE, FALKINGHAM EMPHASISED THE IMPORTANCE OF GIVING SOMETHING BACK TO THE CLUB WHERE HE HAS ACHIEVED SO MUCH.

INTERVIEW BY NICKOLAS MCINALLY



"I just wanted to give something back to the area. This football club has given me so much and I am very thankful for it all. I want to pay that forward and hopefully the little things I can do will help to improve the young talents who choose to come to our PDC.

"I know exactly what the chairman and the manager see for this football club. I want to play a role in that by developing players within the PDC. However, we also want to attract even more people to join our PDC system.

"It's been quite the journey since I joined the club and we still have a long way to go. I am really looking forward to seeing what this role within the PDC has in-store."

A few weeks in and Falkingham believes that the club's vision for the role is one which he is very much aligned with.

"I am really enjoying my new role in the club's Player Development Centre, it's something which I have done before with the football club and I just felt the timing was right to get back involved.

"Dave Riley and Josh Walsh offered me the opportunity to get back involved and it fit well with me to be quite honest. I am working with an age group which is completely new to me. Having been out of coaching for a few years, I felt for my development as a coach it just felt right for me.

"Week-by-week I feel like my confidence is growing so hopefully I can keep working to develop but also working to improve the talent we have within the PDC."



However, the desire to give something back is not the only thing which fueled his motivation to get back involved.

"I've had a taste of coaching before and I am getting even more experience now which is important because it is something I would like to do in the future. I want to build that relationship with the players that I work with.

"As a coach, you get into the job because you want to see the people you work with improve. That's not just short-term, that's over the next couple of years. If we do that, hopefully we can hang onto them and have them representing the first-team.

"That's the ultimate goal, it's for us as coaches and for the PDC as a whole. We are always striving to make sure that pathway is available to those who are good enough to make it. We want them to have those aspirations of playing with the first-team but also the opportunity to make it happen."

Having shared a dressing room with the defender for the last two seasons, the midfielder is pleased to see Rory McArdle involved in what he believes

is a high quality coaching set up.

"I've been really impressed by the quality of all the coaches and I'm sure Rory feels the same. He has been working with the academy and with the PDC as well, I am very keen to see how both Josh Law and Rory work with the academy.

"Every Thursday after training, I go up and I watch their sessions to see how they approach things. That has been fantastic for my development as a coach but also the lads who coach alongside me on a Thursday night have been first class.

"Tom Hullock has been a great help to me so far. I remember working with him a few years back and you can see the development which he has made as a coach.

"I have learned a lot from people like Tom, Josh Walsh, Michael Clothier, Ian Watson and Ryan Smith. These are the guys who I have been working alongside and it's brilliant to work with them.

"Seeing the quality those guys have, the kids coming along to the PDC are in really good hands and it's a great team to be a part of."

While praising the calibre of the coaches involved, Falkingham is pleased to see the club play such an active role in the local community.

"It's really important that the club doesn't just stand still. We have to keep working and to always be looking to strengthen that presence in the local community. Of course, the PDC has been hugely successful in the past but it's about how can we keep moving forward.

"When the kids come in we want them to have a strong relationship with this club. When they come in, it's about progressing them and getting the very best talents through. While doing that, we have to keep looking to entice the young footballers in the area to join the PDC and to continue that improvement.

"On the back of that, we all hope that they come and watch us play on a Saturday. With that attachment and the contact with them on the training pitch, we want them to enjoy their football with us but also build those relationships as a whole which is what we are all about."

Having undertaken a role with the club's U15s side, the coach has high



"We want kids who have watched the club throughout the years, kids who have been involved from an early age and those who have that strong attachment with the club. That will hopefully spur them on even more to achieve with this club.

"The more we do that, the more examples we give to children who are at the very start of that process and they have that motivation to keep giving it everything they have to develop."

Having experienced so much as a player, the midfielder hopes to use the experience he has gained to benefit the future generations through his coaching.

"It's all about passing experience on. I have so much experience as a player which I want to take forward into being a coach. I'm now trying to see things from a coaches point of view but I'm still trying to help those round about me improve.

"I've been at this club for the majority of my career now. I'm trying to help the next generation to play for the club so my experience couldn't have been any more tailored to fit them."

This passion is something which transfers into what he hopes to achieve in the not too distant future as a coach.

"The aim for me as a coach is pretty simple. I want to develop players who will be good enough for the manager one day. That is where I am at right now and hopefully I can do that.

"There is no better feeling as a coach than seeing what you have been working on paying off. That is another aim for me to carry on feeling that buzz. I'm constantly learning, constantly improving and it has been an absolute pleasure so far."

hopes for his side and has praised their desire to improve.

"The kids are great, they are always wanting to learn, they are always listening and doing the right things. I'm still playing but I want to be proactive, I want to get out there and learn which makes me really fortunate.

"As a player, you have years and years at academy level which teaches you how to play football. However, as a coach you don't have that opportunity unless you are willing to put the hours in. That is what I am trying to do.

"I'm still in the process of figuring out what my strengths and weaknesses are as a coach. I am working with the team who have the experience and hopefully this will be really beneficial to me when I am at the point where I can't play anymore."

As the club announced a new partnership with Rossett Sports Centre last month, this also saw the launch of a new Player Development Centre within Harrogate.

Speaking on this expansion, the club's captain believes this can have

a positive effect on the entire football club for years to come.

"It just goes to show how successful the PDC has been. It's in a fantastic position now where it is able to evolve and move forward. The more kids that we get into Harrogate Town kits and into our system then hopefully we have a better pool of players to choose from.

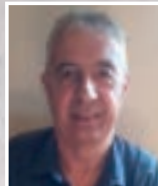
"In giving them that education, hopefully we can get them into the academy first of all. From there we can help them continue on their journey and ideally get them ready to make the step up to the first-team.

"It's about getting those home-grown players. That is something which is important to the manager and to the football club as a whole.

BACK IN TIME SEASON 1971/72



TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN
PHIL HARRISON LOOKS
BACK AT TOWN'S 1971/72 SEASON
AND A MEETING WITH
CROOK TOWN

Harrogate Town were a Yorkshire league Division Three club in 1971/72 and had captured the much wanted Peter Gunby as the new player/manager/coach and Captain It was a good start to the league campaign with two victories.

Next on the agenda was an FA Amateur Cup Preliminary round tie at Wetherby Road on Saturday 11 September 1971 against famous cup fighters Crook Town, a team familiar with the lush turf of Wembley.

Secretary Charles Hartley said, 'They are one of the finest teams to visit Harrogate'. Crook a Northern league team had won the Amateur Cup five times in 1901, 1954, 1959, 1962 and 1964. It was certainly unusual for a local club to be drawn against such famous opposition so early on, as a Harrogate team are usually drawn against local teams from the West Riding, but on this occasion, the F.A. extended the zoning system.

There was no Gunby for the Crook tie as he was not allowed to play and was replaced by my old teammate Barry Whiteley. Town held their illustrious visitors to a 2-2 draw after Tony Vincent scored an 88th minute equaliser in front of 400 to secure a replay. Jim Hague scored the other goal. Town issued a special programme for this game priced 2d (1p).

Prior to the replay at Crook Town they tossed for colours as both played in amber and black and a four figure crowd was expected. The match itself ended in a 2-1 win for Crook Town with Hague scoring a consolation for Town but may have been so different, as after conceding a late goal they nearly forced the match into extra time but were thwarted by a headed clearance off the goal line.



Town finished the season with promotion as runners-up and Jim Hague (pictured far right), who holds record with most goals for Town with 135, finished top scorer with 18 from 27 games whilst Tony Vincent (pictured right) made 299 Town appearances for the club.



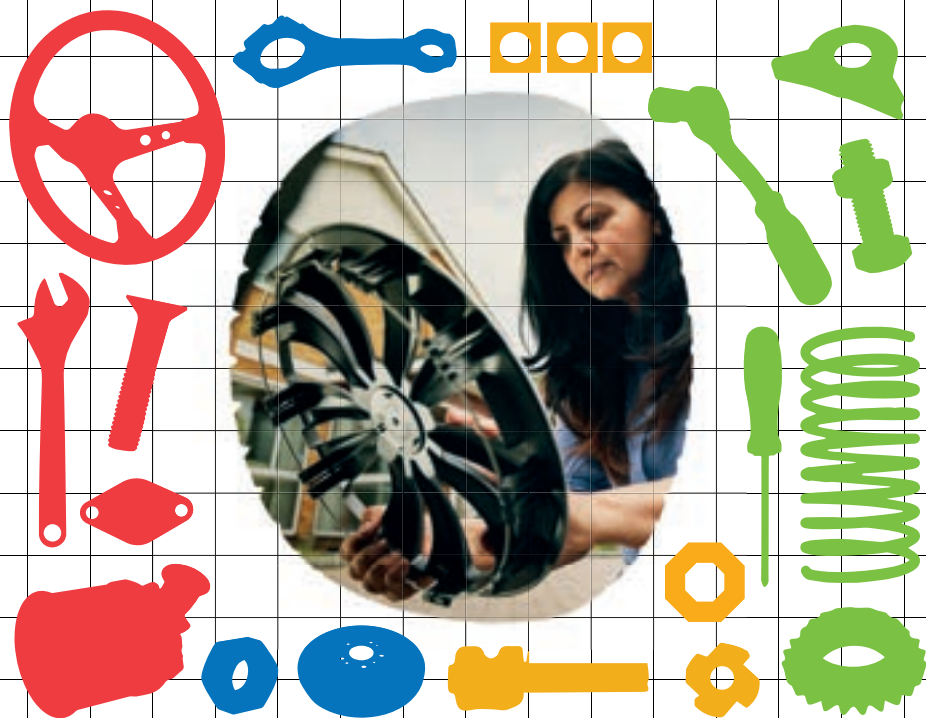
