

WARREN BURRELL

VICE-CAPTAIN WARREN BURRELL ADMITS HE IS EXCITED BY THE PROGRESS TOWN CONTINUE TO MAKE BOTH ON AND OFF THE FIELD AS HE DRAWS CLOSE TO 400 APPEARANCES FOR THE CLUB.

"I have been here a long time now and the club has come so far in that time. I am really proud of what we have achieved so far and I was really pleased to sign that contract extension because I still see my future here.

"We still have so much to achieve and every time I cross that white line I do so with the aim of being the best possible version of myself for the club, the fans and the coaching staff.

"I take it upon myself to be a leader for this group, both on and off the pitch. Getting that contract signed early and being able to focus on my football was the best thing that could have happened for me."

However, the defender has found it hard to enjoy Town's success on the road this season highlighting the club's home form as an area for improvement between now and the end of the season.

Town's number six has been an ever present in Simon Weaver's line-up for key results on the road including draws with Stockport & Wrexham and wins against Newport & Grimsby.

Speaking on the season so far, Burrell said: "-It's hard to really put the season into context before we have got to the end to be honest. We have had some great spells over the course of the campaign but there has also been runs where we have been disappointed.

"The Blackburn and Mansfield defeats are two that stand out. Heavy defeats like that are not acceptable but you look at something like our away form, it has been fantastic.

"Of course, mentioning the away form, we have to look at our form at home. We have been poor this season at home, we simply haven't won enough of our home matches and we need to address that.

"It's been fantastic to be a part of performances like Wrexham and Stockport away. However, knowing we can reach those levels makes the disappointing performances at home even more frustratina.

"We want to give the home fans more afternoons like that, they come out in their numbers every week. We are looking to enhance our home





following so it's definitely frustrating that we haven't been able to give them more with results at home.

"The Bradford game is always a big one in our season, looking at the game it's a perfect opportunity for us to start picking up results at home. It's a derby and of course that means a lot to the fans. It also means a lot to us as players and staff.

"We have enjoyed good results against Bradford since coming into the league. However, they count for nothing if we don't go and put in a good performance today.

"There is no doubting the fact that our squad is full of quality players. It has been that way for a while now but we have real belief in the group of players we have.

"Everyone here is united, we have a common goal of giving our all for this football club and hopefully that can see us finish as high up the league table as possible."

Throughout the previous 390 appearances, Simon Weaver has relied heavily on Burrell's versatility to perform across the backline and in midfield. When speaking on that challenge, Burrell is pleased to be helping the football club in whatever way he can.

"That versatility is something I have been able to provide for a while now, I am used to the challenge of that. I have done my bit for this club by playing in multiple positions.

"I am always keen to do whatever I can to help this football club. If that is how I do that then I will continue to give my all when I am called upon."

"Obviously, it can impact your rhythm as a player a little bit. However, that is a challenge that I have had to get used to over the years.

"Naturally, this season there has been times where I haven't been in the team and that has been tough. I want to play every possible game but I have knuckled down and worked hard in training to prepare for when the opportunity does come."



With a fairly resolute backline this season, Burrell believes this is a key indicator of the togetherness the squad has off the field and a factor which cannot be underestimated.

"It's a huge thing to have that harmony, if you are to achieve success then there has to be quality across the squad. That competition for places drives a standard and I think we have that here.

"Everyone playing knows they need to be at a certain standard, if they are not meeting that then there is a talented player waiting for their opportunity to impress.

"The mentality within our group has been fantastic this season. We have maintained level head throughout the ups and downs. We have been involved in some crazy games this season but after our defeats we have dealt with the disappointment quickly.

"That's the beauty of football, there is always a chance to put a disappointing result right. We have worked hard to make sure we do that more often than not."

In discussing the group dynamics, the

33-year-old believes club captain Josh Falkingham has a key role to play in this mentality.

"As captain and vice-captain, Falks and I have a huge role to play in this football club. Not all of his contributions are visible. This season, he has had to handle the disappointment of not being in the team.

"That is something that we have had to come to terms with as older lads, we want to play every single game possible but that isn't always the best option.

"However, he has shown fantastic professionalism to put that behind him and to make sure he is there as a leader for the lads who are playing.

"He is a role model for the whole squad, every day he applies himself so well in training and that rubs off on the players around him."

As vice-captain, Town's number six also took the opportunity to praise midfielder and close friend George Thomson who currently leads the way on the scoring charts for Town.



"Thommo has been amazing, throughout this season he has consistently delivered important goals and assists. His record is unbelievable and seeing him every day in training, you can see how dedicated he is to his craft.

"He is the ultimate professional, every day he is one of the first in and the last out. He is always in the gym and is always doing everything he can to be the best possible version of himself.

"He has belief in himself but has worked hard too. Every time he goes onto the pitch, you can see he is giving absolutely everything he has."

The defender is also pleased to see Jack Muldoon reap the rewards of his work on the training pitch.

"He dedicates himself to his game, every day he is one of the first in and one of the last out. At 34, he is always trying to better himself. He is never happy with where his game is at and he is always doing everything he can to be on the pitch.

"When he plays, he runs himself into the ground for the club and this season he has been chipping in with the numbers when we have needed him too.

"We played together at Sheffield FC and at Worksop Town so I love to see someone like him doing so well."

While paying tribute to the club's 'old guard' Burrell is pleased to see James Belshaw back at the club, having played a huge role in our two promotions in recent seasons.

"He brings a calmness to our back four, you can see the quality he has as a shot stopper and with the ball at his feet, Off the pitch, he is a personality and someone we have known for a very long time.

"He was part of our success to get to this point, it is nice to see him back with us. It was a move that came from nowhere really but since then it's been clear to see the quality he has brought to the football club."

Looking ahead to the remaining games of the campaign, Town's vice-captain has urged the squad to seize their opportunity and make this campaign one to remember.

"We want to keep progressing season

on season, the record points tally is a sign of progress but there will still be a slight disappointment if we don't finish as high up the table as we believe we can.

"We have worked hard to put ourselves in some fantastic positions at different stages of the season. We want that to reflect on our league position come the end of the season.

"There has been times this season where we have shown a level of consistency which we haven't been able to do in previous seasons. Next season, we want to continue with that consistency while cutting out the bumps in the road.

"We want to be consistent through our style of play, we want to be consistent in our messages and in our vision of what we are trying to achieve. Personally, I want to keep grafting and doing everything I can for this football club.

"We don't want to go into next season on the back of disappointing form at home. We want to see the end of that this season and hopefully we can put that right with the home games that remain.

"If we can, we go into next season flying and confident in our ability and hopefully this place can be a fortress during the next campaign."

As the 400 appearance landmark rolls into view, Burrell admits he is excited for the future.

"As a club, we have to keep progressing, from the outside, people will say we are punching above our weight but we want to keep going. We want to keep taking this club to places it has never been before

"I have always been able to see the progress the club is making. I think that comes from the club's values and those are implemented by the likes of the gaffer, Thirs and the chairman.

"As players we are right behind them because they want to take the club as high as they possibly can."

PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT A MFMORABLE GAME IN OUR HISTORY

t's amazing to think that we met Bradford City 16 times pre-season at Wetherby Road before meeting up for the first time in competition in our first season in EFL for 2020/21.

That season Town completed the double over 'The Bantams' winning 1-0 away with a Lloyd Kerry goal and 2-1 at home thanks to goals from Jack Muldoon and Josh McPake with Andy Cook scoring for City but unfortunately behind closed doors due to the pandemic.

Our first ever encounter was over 40 years ago prior to the 1982/83 season against their reserve side winning 3-1, 1983/84 saw a 2-1 defeat, 1984/85 Town won 3-2, 1985/86 not sure of result but all proceeds went to the City disaster appeal after that horrific fire at Valley Parade. Town won 3-0 1986/87 when Trevor Cherry was their manager, 1987/88 lost 4-3, 1988/89 result unknown, 1989/90 lost

6-3 with Terry Yorath as City's boss before a break until 1992/93 and a 1-1 draw with Frank Stapleton in charge. We lost the 1993/94 match 4-3 and 1994/95 drew 2-2. It was a 10 year gap before we met again, perhaps because City were now in the Premier League 1999/2000 and 2000/01 with Town in Northern Premier League Division One, six leagues apart. How times have changed! The next time they met was at Wetherby Road on Friday 9 July 2004 with Bradford, now in the Championship under new manager Colin Todd and Town in the Conference North. It ended in a 5-0 loss for Town against a strong Bantams side in front of 811 Bradford scorers were Muirhead, Schumaker, Windass, Summerbee, and Penford.


































U18S ACADEMY

In the 31st-minute Harry Hindle's goalward bound header was brilliantly saved by the home keeper. Town continued to push for the opener and O'Boyle was again denied after smart work from Ilesanmi and Wilson

Hartlepool began to grow into the game in the final stages of the half, but Alex Mooney in the Town goal remained largely untroubled and the teams went in goalless at the break.

Town finally got their reward just 26 seconds after the restart as Wilson beat his defender before striking the ball into the roof of the net.

Town continued to control possession and create chances and on 64 minutes,, Town finally got the second goal that their dominance deserved as O'Boyle intercepted a loose pass to race through on goal and slot the ball home

Hartlepool looked to get back into the game and on 78 minutes pulled one back as the Pools striker tapped in on the line after Mooney had superbly kept out three attempts but Town had failed to be clear

Three minutes later substitute Samuels made an instant impact to restore Town's two goal cushion picking up the ball in the final third and hitting a long range strike into the bottom left corner.

Town comfortably saw out the remaining minutes to register a thoroughly deserved and muchneeded 3-1 away victory.



City's skipper signed for the Bantams in July 2022 following the expiry of his contract at Hull City. Naturally a deeplying midfielder, Smallwood graduated from Middlesbrough's academy and featured 60 times for Boro. A loan spell at Rotherham was made permanent in 2014, and in three years with the Millers, he made over 100 appearances. The experienced midfielder, who has now made over 400 career appearances, enjoyed lengthy spells at Blackburn and Hull City, where he took the captaincy.



Brad joined the Bantams in July 2022 following his departure from Fleetwood Town. The right-back began his career in Middlesbrough's academy before enjoying loan spells at York City, Hartlepool United and Accrinaton Stanley. An experienced defender, Halliday has spent time in Sky Bet League One with Doncaster Rovers and Fleetwood Town, before moving to Bradford and became one of three players to amass over 50 appearances in his debut campaign.



JAMIE WALKER

Signing in the summer of 2022 after spending the second half of the 2021/22 campaign on loan at the University of Bradford Stadium, the Scot began his career in his home country, playing over 240 times for Hearts across two spells. Scoring 43 times for his boyhood club, Walker won promotion to the Scottish Premiership twice before beginning life in England at Wigan Athletic. The attacking midfielder won promotion to the Championship with the Lactics before moving back to Hearts in 2019.

ALEX GILLIEA

Alex joined City from Scunthorpe United on a two-year deal in the summer of 2021. for a third spell with the Bantams. The 26-year-old who wore the captain's armband on numerous occasions at the Sands Venue Stadium during the 2020/21 season, spent the second half of the 2016/17 campaign on loan at the Bantams from Newcastle United. before returning the following campaign. Gilliead aslo played for Shrewsbury Town in Sky Bet League One, before spending two seasons with the Iron.

ANDY COOK

After spending the second half of the 2020/21 season on loan with the Bantams, Cook signed permanently from Mansfield Town in June 2021.

Born in Bishop Auckland, Cook started his professional career at Carlisle United before finding regular football at Barrow. He ended his three-year spell in Cumbria as Barrow's top goalscorer, netting 17 in 39 appearances.

The striker then moved to Grimsby Town in the summer of 2012, before another spell at Barrow. Cook then spent two seasons at Tranmere Rovers and was the top goalscorer in both of his seasons at Prenton Park, aiding Tranmere to promotion into the EFL in 2017/18.

Establishing himself in the EFL, the No.9 spent time at Walsall and Mansfield Town, before signing for the Bantams on loan in the 2020/21 season.

Cook had his most prolific campaign in 2022/23, scoring 31 goals in all competitions and becoming the first Bantam in history to end the season as the outright divisional top goalscorer, picking up the club's Player of the Year award. This year the 33-year-old tops the City scoring charts again with 15 goals so far this campaign.


