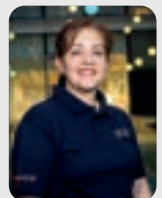

It was a night where there were so many positives to take, we defended well throughout and managed to get a clean sheet as reward for that, we knocked the ball about well and put together some great passing moves.

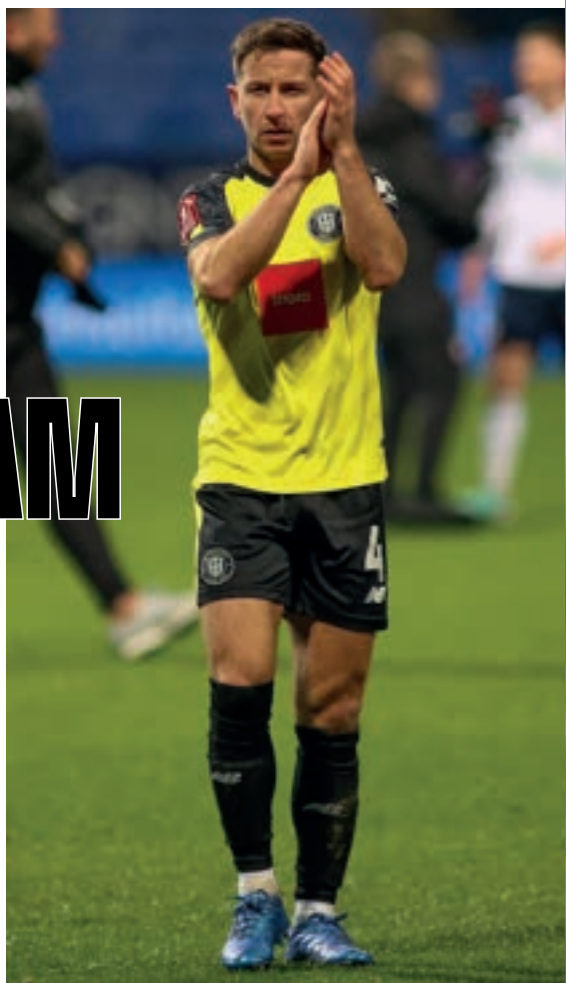
George Thomson steps up once again with yet another important contribution. Watching him play, you can see there is a confidence and moments like that just underline the quality he has in those forward areas.

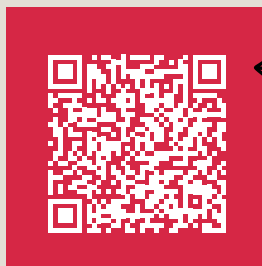

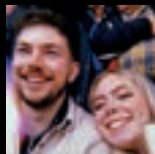

JACK MULDOON

'HE'S 34 AND JUST SEEMS TO BE GETTING BETTER AND BETTER.'

THE WORDS OF TOWN MANAGER SIMON WEAVER DESCRIBING HIS EVER PRESENT NUMBER 18 JACK MULDOON FOLLOWING ON FROM HIS DOUBLE TO SEAL THE THREE POINTS AGAINST SUTTON EARLIER THIS SEASON.

OF COURSE, HIS GOALSCORING EXPLOITS DID NOT STOP THERE AS MULDOON NETTED HIS 10TH OF THE CAMPAIGN AGAINST GILLINGHAM LAST MONTH.

WHEN ASKED ABOUT THE IMPRESSIVE RETURN, MULDOON BELIEVES THERE ARE MANY CONTRIBUTING FACTORS WHICH HAVE ALLOWED HIM TO HIT THE HEIGHTS CONSISTENTLY THIS SEASON.

INTERVIEW BY NICKOLAS MCINALLY

"It's got a lot to do with what I am doing off the pitch, I have always stuck by my diet. I take my dog out every day and end up walking anywhere between five and seven miles every day.

"My partner is a big help too, we have two young kids and she takes the responsibility to get up with them 95% of the time during the night.

"I always track my sleep to make sure I am resting well, I couldn't do that without her and I think that helps me to stay as fit as I can.

"On the pitch, I feel like I've been a bit more selfish in my own personality over the course of this season.

"Over the last few years, I've just been

accepting passing the ball when I had the opportunity to shoot myself. My movement too was always to help others out where now I am looking to help myself and be a traditional striker.

"With that, I am leaving the rest of the lads to manage themselves rather than me trying to help them do that in a sense. I've just got my head down and started to try and be a striker and contribute with the goals."

Having already achieved two promotions during his time with the yellow & black, Muldoon is pleased to see the club battling towards the top end of the table once again.

"Obviously it's been a good season for the club, I have always wanted

us to be fighting for those play-offs. The four seasons we have had in the EFL have been tough but I feel like we have held our own.

"Everything has started to come to fruition if you like, it's been really good to be part of something like that. It has been an enjoyable season and one that all the lads have enjoyed.

"Over the last four years, we have gone up against some really top clubs and battled really well. You would probably say we technically we shouldn't be where we are, but we are here on merit.

"We have held our own at this level, the success of doing something like that allows us to attract better players and then all of a sudden you



start creeping up the table and find yourself where we are now."

Perhaps a sign of what was to come for Muldoon, Town's number 18 started and scored the winning goal on our opening day win away to Doncaster.

"It was a funny situation for me because of what was happening with Luke at the time. I wasn't actually due to start, I was told a couple of days before that situation unfolded.

"The manager then pulled me in on the Friday and told me that the club needed me. He said I was starting and looking back at my career I have enjoyed playing in a side where I am needed in that sense.

"We go and get a 1-0 win at Doncaster. That is an achievement in itself so that was really exciting for me to get that goal too."

With competition high, Muldoon also watched fellow striker Sam Folarin net in his first appearance of the season against Carlisle.

However, the experienced pro believes this competition has been beneficial for the strikers themselves and the team as a whole.

"I really like the fact we have Sam in our squad, he is obviously a fast player, he's so direct and he gives us that massive outlet.

"We just need to get Sam fit and firing. When Sam's fit and at it, he's probably a League One player and he'll know himself. But when he's not quite at that level it's harder for him to show that ability.

"I have always stood by Sam and tried to help him to improve, I want him to do well and he is a player who is a huge asset for this club and has a lot of potential to keep improving.

"Bringing someone like Marchy in as well, that always adds to the fight we have within the squad. I played with him three years ago and I know the type of player he is.

"He's really sharp in the box, he reacts a lot quicker than most and that means he's deadly in the penalty area. Building up to goal, he is really



good at linking up too so you know the fight he brings."

While Muldoon himself is enjoying an impressive campaign, close friend and team mate George Thomson has also hit the heights over the course of this season.

Muldoon believes Thomson is receiving the rewards which his work ethic and professionalism deserves.

"I am immensely proud of Thommo, when I first joined the club he was in and out of the team a lot. However, with a character like his, he kept working hard and improving to get to the level he is at today.

"You can see he does everything right as a professional, I am really pleased for him because he is achieving landmarks he wants to achieve.

"We are really lucky to have him at the club to be honest. I always hang around with Thommo because I know he is doing everything right. It doesn't matter what it is, he is always doing it right.

"In training, something like passing drills but I will always make sure I am working with him. I know doing that

and working with him will get the best out of me.

"This season, he has contributed to a lot of the goals I have scored and I would like to think I have did my best to repay that favour where possible."

With James Belshaw rejoining the club in the January transfer window, Muldoon believes his style of play was a perfect fit to unlocking the club's full potential.

"He is a great character, it was a tough one to see him go to Bristol Rovers but at the time it was something we had to do.

"I knew when he left it was a big space to fill. He's gone away and improved, he is very much a possession-based goalkeeper and that style ties in perfectly with the style we have as a team.

"We are lucky to have someone like him to be honest, there is no surprise that we continued to improve and pick up more and more wins after he joined.

"Off the pitch as well, guys like Falks, Waz, Thommo, Belly and I have all got the club at heart. We have been here



long enough and want to do what we can to get the best out of the players in our squad.

"We will try and get the younger lads to bring out their personality a little bit. That is probably a big difference between our club and other clubs.

"If you go elsewhere, there probably isn't as big a group of players who have been there for as long to help get the best from the squad."

With the club continuing to mount a challenge on those above them with three games remaining, the striker admits it's an exciting position to be in.

"I really hope we do make a push for those playoff positions but either way it's a great position to be in. If nothing comes of the next three games then we can still be proud of everything that we have achieved across the season.

"It is a proud moment for us all to beat the record points tally, we have always tried to do everything we can to get the club to finish as high up the league table as possible.

"It is not always plain sailing, we have

put a lot into this season so I am pleased that we have something to take away from it regardless of what happens between now and the end of the season."

With next season just around the corner, Town's experienced forward has urged the squad to seize the opportunity and build on what has been a successful season.

"We aren't settling on that, we are looking to use the building blocks from this season to push on again next season.

"If we can be top three away from home next season and build our home form to be top six then we will be in a much better position.

"We have done well at home recently, but I don't really look into that so much because the pitch at our place is probably the top three in the league. However, we have to balance out our away and home form next season to improve on where we end up at the end of this season.

"It's come at a great time, we have got two good wins at home recently in Bradford and Gillingham. We still have to play Grimsby, Sutton and MK but

we do so with a confidence knowing we have beaten some good teams at home recently.

"We have our tails up a little bit here at home which is a good thing. That puts a lot of confidence through our ranks and personally I am looking at next season to see if we can continue that."

However, Muldoon admits the squad is all on the same page having held several conversations about what is to come.

"We all speak and think out loud, everyone in the group is on the same page. We are all very ambitious and we know what we need to do to improve.

"Hopefully, we can take that on board and put it into practice. Naturally, the better we do as a collective, the better the individuals in the squad do personally speaking.

"As a young lad, if you're in the play-off spot and you're 21, 20 years old, you're attracting interest from the levels above. That ambition starts again right from the first day of pre-season with what they are doing on and off the pitch."

BACK IN TIME

TOWN'S CLUB HISTORIAN PHIL HARRISON LOOKS BACK AT A MEMORABLE GAME IN OUR HISTORY



The history page this week can't really be anything else but our first ever game in the Vanarama National League Premier at the CNG Stadium as it was known then, against today's visitors Sutton United.

Firstly, on a personal note I was amazed to see Town's first fixture was at home to Sutton (who also played on a 3G surface). Many years ago I went to St. Cecilia Roman Catholic primary school on the London Road only a short distance from their Gander Green Lane ground. Also for that first matchday programme I wrote about 'Remembering Sutton' and a week after the game two Sutton fans, brothers Tony and Laurie Burke, emailed me saying they had attended the same school. What a coincidence. We've kept in touch ever since.

Right, now on to the football and this historic match which attracted a crowd of 1,378 and ended in a 2-2 draw. The visitors took the lead when

Aswad Thomas passed to Charlie Clough who headed home on 35 minutes but Town equalised on the hour mark with a tap in by new signing Jack Muldoon with a debut goal and Town's first at this level.

Another new boy Kelvin Langmead looked to have won it for Town in the 85th minute but Sutton won a penalty in the 93rd minute and Jamie Collins made no mistake from the spot smashing the ball past James Belshaw to make it two apiece!
